Who We Are

Dog Pack Rescue Inc. is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization founded in 2004 by Shari Johannes and John Jones.

While volunteering at a local animal control facility Shari and John were shocked at the number of adoptable companion animals that were being euthanized weekly. Together they decided to form a no-kill dog rescue that was not focused on breed, size or age, but on temperament and personality. The dogs at Dog Pack Rescue do not live in cages on cement – they have free run of five acres, and luxuries like couches and beds to sleep on, heat/ac and gourmet meals on special occasions.

DOG PACK RESCUE INC. is dedicated to the rescue of adoptable companion dogs in order to prevent needless euthanasia of these healthy animals.

What We Do

Our mission is to rescue dogs from “death row” at county animal control facilities. Weekly we travel to rural shelters the day before euthanasia and select dogs to enter our program. Each dog is evaluated for temperament and personality. We fully vet our dogs before adoption. Each animal is fully vaccinated, heartworm tested (and treated if necessary), spayed/neutered, micro-chipped, dewormed and thoroughly checked by our veterinarian.

We screen all prospective adopters and follow up on each adoption. We never want one of our dogs to end up at animal control again, so we handle all adoptions as a two-week trial, refunding the adoption fee if the dog is not the right fit. We provide lifetime support to the adopter, assisting with medical costs, training, and boarding – ***no matter what the case, we will always take our dog BACK!***



Accomplishments

- 2005: 915 dogs were saved from death (including almost 100 Katrina dogs).
- 2006: 925 dogs were saved from kill shelters.
- 2007: over 1,000 dogs were saved from euthanasia.
- In 2005 and 2006 we lowered the kill rate of adoptable canines in Bartow County by almost 25%; and in Floyd, Gordon, Walker and Cherokee Counties by more than 10%.
- 2007 our focus on the following counties helped lower euthanasia rates by more than 12% in: Floyd, Walker, Catoosa, Murray, and Cherokee Counties.
- Our 2009 goal is to save 1,200 dogs!

Volunteering

Dog Pack Rescue Inc. is always in need of volunteers, both during the week and at weekend adoptions. Volunteers are welcome to show up at adoption events, or come to the shelter during the week. We also need assistance with administrative tasks, fundraising, transportation, etc. Please call or email us for more information.

If you love dogs but don't want one full time, consider becoming a foster for one of our loveable dogs who are waiting for their forever homes. Foster homes are only responsible for the daily care of the animal, and some transportation. Dog Pack provides you with training, equipment, food and any necessary vet care/preventatives.
